2 Verbal Morphology

Guinin/Kwini has three number suffixes: *-m/-ma* that means 'two' (dual form), *-ni* with the meaning 'few', and *-rri* that means 'two or more' (plural form). However, the plural suffix is not so frequent, it is used only when the prefixed verb form is ambiguous.

3 Conjunction

Two clauses can be simply juxtaposed to form a coordinated sentence.

- (1) benn ngirndi durr ngindi-di
climb:up I:fell descend I:fell-INT
'I climbed up, then down.' [McGregor, 1993, p. 54]

There are postpositions in Kwini that mark case, and one that marks number.

1. *-ngindalu* locative
2. *-gu* dative
3. *-yanga* ablative
4. *-we* purposive
5. *-nyine* instrumental
6. *-gude* comitative
7. *-nangga* genitive
8. *-miya* dual
